




Social protection expenditure, Bosnia and Herzegovina, 2019 (% of GDP)



Law on Support to Families with Children in Federation BiH (2022)

- "Official Gazette of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina", no. 52/22, od 01.07.2022. godine.
- This Law comes into force on the eight day, following the day of its publishing in the "Official Gazette of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina" on July 9 2022
- the law will begin to apply 3 months after coming in force – on October 10 2022.

Law on Principles of Social Protection, Protection of Civilian Victims of War, and Protection of Families with Children (1999)

 Right to child allowance belongs to family whose aggregate monthly income (realized through all means except the income realized from social protection and protection of families with children) per member of the household do not exceed the amount <u>determined by the</u> <u>cantonal legislation</u> as the lowest income sufficient for sustenance (article 91).



Law on Principles of Social Protection, Protection of Civilian Victims of War, and Protection of Families with Children (1999)

- Favorable treatment in acquisition and exercise of rights, and higher amounts are given to:
- 1. child without one or both parents,
- 2. family with the child with disabilities
- 3. family in which one of both parents are persons with disabilities.

Child Allowance (2022)

- It will be financed from the FBiH budget
- Conditions for exercising right:
- 1. children up to 18 years of age
- 2. the child is not placed in a foster family or social welfare institution.



Child Allowance in FBiH in 2022

Means test (monthly income per family member):

40 % minimum wage in FBiH 217.2 KM in 2022

Amount of child allowance in 2022:

19% minimum wage in FBiH 103.17 KM (monthly) in 2022

Pregnancy allowance for unemployed wife/mother in 2022

- It will be financed from cantonal budgets
- Condition: mothers who are not employed or are studying will be entitled without additional conditions,
- Cantons have the right to increase amount.



Pregnancy allowance for unemployed wife/mother in 2022

Amount of pregnancy Duration allowance (months) 55% minimum wage in FBiH 12 (298 KM)



Conclusions

- Goal: to provide all children with approximately equal material conditions for a healthy family life is not reached
- Such a divided organizational structure without effective coordination mechanisms results in various inequalities based on the places of residence.
- The establishment of state-level coordination mechanisms is one of the prerequisites for the European Union accession. Nevertheless, there has been little sign of a willingness to take a harmonized and coordinated approach.
- The reform is a step in the right direction, but it is partial and is unlikely to benefit an average household with children
